### NARSC @ ASSA

Since 2022, NARSC has hosted a special session on Regional Science topics and methodologies at each of the annual meetings of the American Economic Association (also known as the Allied Social Science Associations meeting). Held in the first week of January, this event is the world's largest gathering of economists from various sub-disciplines.

The 2025 session was organized by Dr. Sandy Dall'erba (University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign) and Dr. Dawn Thilmanny (Colorado State University), both long-standing members of the Regional Science community. The session's theme, "Preparing Today's Agrifood Supply Chain



for the Challenges of Tomorrow," was chosen to highlight the increasing vulnerabilities of the food supply chain due to climate-induced disruptions and global population growth. The session attracted numerous submissions from international scholars, requiring a selection of the top four contributions. With around two dozen attendees, the session led to an engaging and productive discussion.

The theme for the 2026 NARSC session at AEA has yet to be determined. If you have suggestions or are interested in contributing to its organization, please reach out to Dr. Dall'erba at dallerba@illinois.edu.

### NERSA nominates new council members

# Review of Regional Studies

### Article Feature: Review of Regional Studies

The <u>Review of Regional Studies</u> (RRS) is the journal of the Southern Regional Science Association (SRSA). RRS publishes papers of interest to a wide array of social science disciplines in which the spatial dimension plays a fundamental role. Robust, rigorous policy analysis at all geographic scales including analysis of regional policies and very local programs as well as papers in which multiple disciplines overlap and contribute to our understanding of the spatial dimension are also of interest. RRS is an open access journal, with no fees for subscription, submission, or publication, that is published online three times a year.

In this issue of the NARSC Newsletter, I would like to share a *RRS* article from the past year that I found interesting. "The Effects of Disaster Relief Insurance on Drought Impacts: A Case Study of Southwest Oklahoma" by Katherine L. Welch, Dayton M. Lambert, Lixia H. Lambert, and Amy Hagerman discusses the impacts of drought, not just on rural farmers, but also on surrounding rural communities. They find that both diversity of agricultural production and enrollment in crop insurance positively contribute to the resilience of rural agricultural communities to drought. I think this is an excellent example of the local, regionally-specific articles that can be published in *RRS*.

I encourage you to take a look at these or other articles from the Review of Regional Studies.

### Association for University Business and Economic Research (AUBER 2025)



The Association for University Business and Economic Research (AUBER) 2025 conference will be held **October 4–7, 2025** in Missoula, Montana. The conference's theme explores the dynamic shifts shaping economic development, population trends, and business opportunities across the country. Information from white papers, policy briefs, scholarly work, applied research projects, survey findings, data dashboards, industry analysis, forecasting, regional economics, quality of life, and much more will be presented.

Expected speakers for the 2025 conference include: David E. Altig, the executive vice president and chief economic adviser of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta; Edward Glaeser, the Fred and Eleanor Glimp professor of economics and chair of the Department of Economics at Harvard University; and Abigail Wozniak, a labor economist and vice president at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis. ## North American Regional Science Council (NARSC 2024)



Join us **November 12–15**, **2025** in Denver, Colorado for the 72nd North American Meetings of the Regional Science Association International (RSAI) sponsored by the North American Regional Science Council (NARSC). NARSC is an international scholarly organization that focuses on regional analysis, ranging from urban and spatial theory to applied problems in regional development, sustainability, environmental management, and rural land use. This is the premier regional science meeting in North America and attracts scholars and practitioners from around the world.

Conference organizers welcome individual papers and organized sessions relating to a wide variety of topics that are included within the diverse realm of regional science. As usual, there will be several organized sessions. These sessions are being organized around research topics such as rural/regional development, the geography of crime, and the impact of natural disasters. The list of special sessions is updated on a regular basis, so check regularly for the most recent list.

To submit an abstract or a complete session, please use our online submission system. The **submission deadline is July 11, 2025**. Decisions regarding the acceptance of papers and sessions will be announced in late August. All presenters, including members of panel discussions, discussants, and session chairs, must register for the conference and pay the registration fee in order to attend and present.

The conference will be held at the Grand Hyatt Denver. A special conference room rate of \$219 (plus taxes) has been negotiated with the hotel. Please consider staying at the host hotel and booking through the NARSC website. Staying at the Hyatt helps NARSC continue to hold these meetings, as NARSC is penalized when attendees do not stay at the hotel.

### Western Regional Science Association (WRSA 2025)



The 65<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Western Regional Science Association (WRSA) will be held **February 11–14**, **2026** at the Eldorado Hotel & Spa in Santa Fe, New Mexico. WRSA's meeting is unique among the regional science conferences, as only full papers (including draft papers) will be accepted for review



#### Assistant/Associate Professor in Agricultural and Regional Economics, Penn State University

The Pennsylvania State University is hiring a nine-month, tenure-track position in agricultural economics at the assistant or associate professor level. The position has a 60% research responsibility and a 40% teaching responsibility. The successful applicant will be expected to develop a nationally and internationally recognized research program focused on regional economics and rural economic development. Pertinent topics, among others, include regional food systems, rural-urban disparities, firm location decisions, issues and opportunities along the rural-urban interface, regional labor markets, and land use changes and policies. The successful candidate will also be expected to secure external funding and to advise and mentor graduate and undergraduate students.

The successful applicant will have the opportunity to join the Center for Economic and Community Development (CECD), Northeast Regional Center for Rural Development (NERCRD), and Institute for Sustainable Agricultural, Food, and Environmental Sciences (SAFES) as a faculty affiliate. Applicants should demonstrate excellent quantitative and communication skills and the ability to work in multi-disciplinary teams. The ability to engage professionally with a diverse population of faculty, staff, and students is required, and the successful candidate will actively strive to provide an inclusive learning environment for all. Documented teaching experience is preferred.
